

A Door of Hope

An identity worksheet in Hosea 2:14-15 | He turns your hardest ground back into a garden

1. WRITE THE WORD

Slow down and copy Hosea 2:14-15 (TPT) by hand below. Let every word land. He is not correcting you here. He is pursuing you.

2. THREE WORDS THAT CHANGE EVERYTHING

PATHAH

"I will allure her"

He initiates. He woos. You do not have to perform your way back to Him. He is already walking toward you.

DABER 'AL-LEV

"Speak to her heart"

Literally: He speaks TO your heart. Not at you. Not about you. The wilderness is where His voice gets quiet and close.

TIQVAH

"A door of hope"

Hope here literally means a cord, an attachment. The rope He hands you is tied to the trouble itself. The door is IN the valley.

3. NAME YOUR VALLEY OF ACHOR

Achor means trouble. It was the place of Israel's worst failure and deepest shame. God did not route around it. He put the door there. What valley have you been avoiding, hiding, or calling unusable?

Now write what it would mean if that exact place became your door:

4. WHO HE SAYS I AM

Read each one out loud. Check the one that is hardest to believe today, then sit with it.

- ☐ I am pursued. He allures me; He does not tolerate me.
- ☐ I am spoken to tenderly. His voice toward me is kind, even in the wilderness.
- ☐ My trouble has a door in it. Nothing in my story is wasted ground.
- ☐ My song is not gone. The joy of my first love is still in me, and He is calling it back.

5. LET HIM SPEAK TO YOUR HEART

Get quiet. Ask Him: "What are You whispering to me in this wilderness?" Write what you sense, without editing it.

He does not wait for you to come home. He walks into the wilderness and whispers your name.
